

Pain and Swelling (Cortisone Flare) The injected cortisone medication can crystallize inside the body. The crystals can cause pain and inflammation that is worse than the pain and inflammation caused by the condition being treated. This side effect is called a cortisone flare.





A corticosteroid taken by mouth or given by intramuscular injection is often called a systemic steroid. Systemic steroids are synthetic derivatives of the natural steroid, cortisol, produced by the adrenal glands, and have profound anti- inflammatory effects. Systemic (cortico)steroids are also called glucocorticoids or cortisones. They include:

It is typically given by injection to reduce inflammation in joints or connective tissues. It is generally safe to use and can offer long-term relief from joint pain and swelling. Injection site pain is the most common side effect. With long-term use, cortisone shots can cause the possible rupture of tendons.



A local steroid injection may be given to reduce inflammation and pain in a joint. The main purpose of the steroid injection is to decrease pain and increase movement and use of the affected area.
